ODYSSEY



On December 15, fourteen seniors from the Peen Charter School departed from Philadelphia for the Soviet Union. The trip was the culmination of an intensive trimester study of Russia. Accompanying the students was Mr. Dresden, four parents and Mrs. Weinberg. The group flew from Kennedy International and then departed late on the 15th for Helsinki via Amsterdam. A short stop in Finland completed, the group flew to Moscow's Sheremetyov Airport, arriving at about 4 p.m. local time.

The Customs inspection and passage were rather rigorous with several people being "torn" apart, including clothing and books. We then transferred to the Intourist Hotel in central Moscow, a short walk from the Kremlin and Red Square. Monday, Tuesday, and part of Wednesday were spent touring and wandering through the Kremlin, observing the many beautiful, gold-domed churches. Other activities included a Bolshoi theater opera, riding the Metro (clean and massive), and shopping in GUM (the department store). One of the more interesting aspects of our stay in Moscow was a visit to School #23 (specializing in the teaching of English). It was modest in facilities decorated everywhere with portraits of Lenin and in general suggesting order and discipline. We also saw the Olympic games' site as well as Moscow State University. There was also a "briefing" by two Party members about contemporary Soviet issues, a presentation which was clearly propagandistic, yet still highly informative. Several of the students asked tough questions about the Middle East and Iran and got responses which were obviously pre-planned.

The uncomfortable flight to Leningrad was compensated for by the deluxe accommodations in the Astoria Hotel. It was constructed before the Revolution and still retains its decadent, capitalist splendor. Just across the street was St. Isaac's Cathedral, a huge and beautiful church which rivals St. Peter's. Also close by was Leningrad University, Palace Square and the Hermitage complex (former Czarist residences now housing two million works of art).

The trip home began at about 11 am local time and included a layover of about three hours in Helsinki, followed by a long, non-stop trans-Atlantic flight to Montreal and then New York. The final and safe return to Philadelphia was made at about 9:30 p.m., December 22nd, a full day after our departure from Leningrad.
