

# HEADMASTER'S MESSAGE

To The Class of 1984:

The fact that Orwell's 1984 has influenced the theme of your Class Record indicates the position that Orwell's ideas occupy in modern thought. Published in 1949, the novel has influenced critics and analysts of modern life in the ensuing decades. As a boy, I read with dread of the prospect of 1984, a prospect characterized by massive restriction of individual rights and action, and by manipulation of thought through the careful engineering of the language process. Certainly, some aspects of that chilling vision are part of our day-to-day reality. Large parts of the world's population live with extremely limited freedom. The language that we use has often been debased by attempts to dictate the way in which we think.

A return to the pages of 1984 reminds a reader of the barren existence of Winston Smith, the novel's central character. He must participate in regular, intensive Hate Periods designed to focus his animosity. Winston's historical sense is blurred since history is constantly being rewritten. Smith's own job is to rewrite old newspaper articles to conform to current ideology. A far-reaching linguistic project is in operation to make it impossible for individuals to have certain thoughts. Daily existence is engineered to deny love and peace.



Fortunately, we have escaped the numbing totality of Orwell's vision. Each day most of us are met with incidents of human kindness and concern. Many of the central values of Penn Charter stand in direct opposition to the society of 1984. The Quaker belief in the individual and the ability of that individual to grow to her/his full potential is vital to Penn Charter. At the same time, the academic skills of clear use of our language help to foster communication and thought. Finally, the concern of the individual for others in society leads us to a broader concern for the community, both local and worldwide, in which we live.

Contrast the life of a student at Penn Charter with the life of Winston Smith. Instead of attending Hate Periods, a student is asked to examine his/her own religious and ethical beliefs in the privacy and silence of Meeting for Worship. Ralph West and others exhort the student to understand the complexity and beauty of the English language. Jack Coleman and members of the history department urge the student to analyze the issues of history by reviewing primary source materials. Teachers give of themselves so that each student may develop his/her talents.

The development of members of the Class of 1984 has upheld the validity of Penn Charter's traditional values. You have distinguished yourselves in many areas. The class has a solid record of academic achievement. Artistically, seniors gave leadership to the excellent fall production of **Godspell** and formed the vast majority of an outstanding Quakers Dozen. Athletically, the fall contained many special moments of team and individual achievement. In addition, the class has entered into its leadership role in the school with energy, enthusiasm, and humor. Steve Bonnie as "Big Brother" will remain in our minds for years to come.

This is 1984, a year full of promise for each of us. You can look beyond this one year to years of promise and fulfillment. We have done our best to prepare you for those years, and we look forward to continued dialogue in the years to come since you leave with the faculty's affection and support.














FACULTY

This year's team, captained by Doug Hawkins, earned an Interac championship for the first time in 14 years. The team got off to an explosive start with two straight shutouts over St. Joe Prep and Perkiomen. Over the course of the season the defense, which recorded two more shutouts, allowed a mere 4 points per game, the highest total being the 14 points scored by Blair. The Blair game proved the team's comeback ability when the Quakers found themselves behind for the first time all season at the balf. This ability proved to be very useful in the Episcopal game when the Churchmen gained an early lead. When city-leading quarterback Small hit first-year sensation Mitchell with a TD pass the scoring was ended at 7-7. The defense, spurred by outstanding play by Bass and Ohlbaum, held Episcopal's star runner Chris Flynn to only one touchdown, far below his season average. After DiGiovonni's Geis Trophy performance and Delaney's 186 yards rushing led the team to victory against G.A., the share of the championship was clinched. Outstanding play all season long was delivered by linemen Hack, Maguire, and Fabbi, and by defensive backfield leader Foley, and Biront, whose 7 interceptions tied a school record, as well as tight-end and lineman superstar Hirshland who was honored by the Maxwell Club for his excellence. 




#### Commencement June 2, 1984



"The philospher Confucius once said that 'Learning without thought is labor lost; thought without learning is perilous.' If the competitiveness here engenders learning without thought, it's a problem; but it's certainly better than the thought without learning that a complete lack of competitiveness might create . . . I don't think that the inquiring mind is being stifled at Penn Charter, but with the competitiveness, we need a balanced perspective on what is education." "Penn Charter is a geographic and intellectual oasis. Geographically, we are surrounded by poverty; and intellectually, our education here makes up part of an elite gorup. I think that we must be conscious of the fact that we are privileged. I think that if we put the advantages that we've had into perspective, in the future we may be able to make those advantages more available to others. And if we are making the effort to do that, perhaps we are carrying the burden of privilege."



"And classmates, today we start a new era; we step out from under the shelter and guidance of Penn Charter, into a complex and everchanging world: one which is filled with many challenges and problems, and in which tomorrow brings even more challenges and problems. But it is not the world which George Orwell depicted in 1984, where the individual has no importance. Today, the individual makes all the difference. and I think it is important to remember that. As John F. Kennedy said twenty-one years ago, 'Man's reason and spirit have often solved the seemingly unsolvable, and we believe it will again . . . Man can be as big as he wants.' So perhaps the greatest thing we can take with us from Penn Charter is such a spirit - a spirit which embraces the challenge to be as big as we can, to take risks and set goals as high as our greatest potential will take us, to live our lives to the fullest, to truly pursue excel-
