























































DEDICATION


I believe that the Penn Charter faculty of today matches that of previous decades in ability and candor. Certainly Jack Rogers has been a


Dr. Katman






Mr. Linton





Special Guests



Roger Lane, Professor of History at Haverford College, spoke to US History students on the conditions in urban America and the rural South in the decades following the Civil War.

Joe Hoeffel, OPC'68, was a candidate for the congressional seat of the 13th district in Pennsylvania; he spent a day with us during the campaign talking about his views on national and foreign policy.







Ed Owrid served Penn Charter for thirty-one years, as a teacher, librarian, and advisor to the Class Record. He taught courses in foreign languages and library sciences, and was a wellspring of information on History, especially the Civil War. Ed ran the library when it was located in what is now the Overseers Room and part of the office; he presided over the move to the beautiful John F. Gummere library in 1968, providing Ed with a facility commensurate with his enthusiasm for helping students learn. He was never too busy to assist a student or a teacher in finding the right book; he gave and received great joy in his calling as Librarian. The first yearbook to mention him as advisor was the 1956 edition, a responsibility he held through his retirement in 1981. In that quarter century of service, the yearbooks reflected a great deal about the students and PC in each year, in bold and subtle ways, a tribute to Ed's flexible guidance and his appreciation of the medium as chronicle and teaching device.

Ed Owrid was a man of dignity, intellect, wit and candor. His contributions were a significant part of Penn Charter's tradition, his spirit of tireless pursuit of knowledge an inspiration to all who knew him.
