From 1941 to 1968, John Flagg Gummere was Headmaster of the William Penn Charter School, making an already superlative school even greater. Known to all as "The Chief", he was a master teacher of the Classics as well as an author of several Latin textbooks. A graduate of PC in 1918, he received degrees from Haverford College & Penn and taught briefly at West Philadelphia High School before coming to PC. One of his classroom innovations copied by many teachers since his time was "Latin Baseball", a technique popular among students and adaptable to other disciplines as well. As Headmaster, Dr. Gummere was equally innovative, adopting new ideas in schedules, grading systems, and administration that were copied by schools around the nation. He was one of the founders of the National Association of Independent Schools, an organization that provides a wellspring of support to teachers and schools throughout America. Dr. Gummere was a Headmaster before the days particular individuals were hired to be business managers, admissions directors, or college counsellors; he did all of these tasks at once, and for many OPCs their college choice was his choice. The Chief knew his boys and the colleges, and had a knack for making a proper match. A phone call from Jack Gummere to a college was sufficient for admission. He was also a strict administrator, holding his faculty to high standards of deportment, professionalism, and growth. In 1969 the Alumni Society established the John F. Gummere Distinguished Teacher Award in his honor, and the Library fittingly bears his name. He was an avid sports fan, and knew the educational value of a strong athletic program; he coined the phrase: "Good Instruction is Better Than Losing." He was also a loyal supporter of the Phillies, and could recite statistics as far back as 1900. Dr. Gummere provided a living example of discipline, hard work, dedication and concern for others to all who knew him, worked with him, or studied under him. We celebrate his life with us, and note with sadness his passing on January 26, 1988. Hail to the Chief!


WRESTLING


SWIMMING

Spring Productions








