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



To The Class Of 1991

I admit to being somewhat daunted by the concept of tying the Class of 1991 to dinosaurs. However, a visit to the second grade to learn about their study of dinosaurs reminded me of the endless fascination associated with those creatures. I also left the lower school with two books of dinosaur riddles which I could quote here, but I am afraid that quoting them would undermine your already skeptical view of my sense of humor. The combination of massive strength and strange vulnerability is of ongoing interest to people of varying ages. What happened to the dinosaurs remains a source of scientific inquiry.

In some ways the comparison to dinosaurs is appropriate. The physical strength of a number of class members has helped to lead the school to many athletic triumphs. Outstanding work by Bill Gallagher, Brien Weick, and others led the football team to a league championship. Swimmer Jim Killinger and class president and wrestler Leo Wyszynski are concluding outstanding seasons as I write this note. On the other hand, the comparison seems terribly stretched. Dinosaurs were never known for their intelligence or for their sensitivity. Class members have demonstrated both qualities throughout the year. In fact, some of the individuals who have led the school in such areas as athletics have also been classroom and



academic leaders. Also individuals such as Jim Smartt have demonstrated considerable artistic talents.

Your selection of dinosaurs as a metaphor clearly rests on the idea of the last all male class. You represent the last class emerging from a tradition that has been rich and fulfilling for students for many decades. As such, you can take pride in your accomplishments and in the accomplishments of those who have gone before you. You, through your individual accomplishments and when you act collectively in positive ways, represent the best of that tradition, and I congratulate

you for it.

At the same time, I have a deep sense that what is particularly meaningful about the Penn Charter tradition is in fact not changing. That belief leads me to the conclusion that as you look back upon your years at the school it will not be the all male tradition that comes most quickly to mind. More importantly, you will, if you are typical of alumni, reflect on the student/teacher relationship and on the efforts of teachers to assist you in the development of your inner talents. Also, you will reflect on classmates and the friendships that have made Penn Charter an important place to you. I also hope that you will reflect on the Quaker tradition and the values of quiet meditation and looking within oneself for meaning. This has been a very positive class in terms of its leadership in Meeting for Worship. I think of the voices of individuals such as Daniel Donaghy and Kwame Kleckley amongst others.



History





Science



Math



The Inter-Ac schedule began with a tough Episcopal team. In a down-to-the-wire game the defense did not falter as Sam




lost tough five-game jobs.



SO THIS IS THE NEW WORLD ORDER.

Traditionally the Class Record sets aside these pages to chronicle the events and occurrances of its senior year. There are always dozens of memorable happenings that transpire in twelve months, and each one leaves a lasting impression in our minds. These photographs act as catalysts in recalling these events, for each revives the feelings and emotions that were felt when they occurred. The happenings pictured shaped the world and influenced our thoughts, making our year what it was.

In these twelve short months, the world witnessed the demise of the Iron Curtain as the final Communist regimes began to fall. Free elections occurred in Romania, the two Germanys were reunited, and the Sandinistas lost general elections in Nicaragua. President Bush reached several agreements with Mikhail Gorbachev, pushed to outlaw flag burning, and watched the Census Bureau tabulate the number of homeless in America. The Supreme Court continued to debate abortion and obscenity, and David Souter was sworn in as a Justice. People rallied behind Nelson Mandella and fought for a cleaner environment on Earth Day, and nature proved its might with a Phillipino earthquake and Mississippi-basin floods. Cincinatti won the World Series, Georgia Tech & Colorado split the national title, Germany won the World Cup, and Mike Tyson lost the title. Pete Rose got out of jail, and Buddy Ryan was out of a job. Still, none of these events seems comparable to what has occcured since August, and is still continuing even as this annual is put to press. In 1991, the United States went to war.

On January 16, at roughly 6:35 in Philadelphia, bombs began to fall on Iraq. Television news coverage brought a distant attack home to everyone's living room, and nearly all the other events of the past eleven months were forgotten. In August a border dispute between Iraq's President Saddam Hussein and Kuwait became an international crisis when Iraqi troops invaded the tiny emirate. Saudia Arabia, fearing its security was at stake, sought protection from both the U.S. and the United Nations. President Bush, in accordance with U.N. resolutions and supported by a 28 nation coalition, drew a "line in the sand": Operation Desert Shield. These defensive forces were soon enlarged to offensive capabilities, and the U.N. authorized them to attack if Iraq did not withdraw from Kuwait. Saddam had five months to remove his troops, but he did not. The January 15 deadline came and went, and nothing happened for a day. This peace, however, was shortlived.

With Congressional support, President Bush began the "liberation of Kuwait". US, Canadian, British, French, and Kuwaiti planes left their bases at 4:30 EST on a northward flight to Iraq, arriving at their targets virtually undetected. They began to bomb military targets with initial success and few casualties. Iraq launched Scud missles towards Saudi Arabia and Israel, seeking to weaken both the defenses and resolve of the coalition. As we prepare to go to press, the air raids continue, while the ground forces await their orders. The results of this war may not be clear until our first class reunion, or perhaps even later.

At home we continue to debate the why and wherefores: war, peace, right, wrong, history, economics, and freedom. Nearly everyone supports our troops in the Gulf, yet the policies of the President are less favored. Students and faculty at Penn Charter have taken an active role regarding events, whether it is involvement in the PC Peace Committee, silent vigils, or speaking in Friends Meeting. The war pervades all thoughts and discussions, and haunts many of us as we sit in solitude. For all of our sakes, we hope that the hostilities can be resolved, lest anyone should die an unnecessary death. This is what clouds our images of 1990-91.
