## To The Class Of 1993

I am always intrigued by the metaphors each of us chooses to describe herself or himself. Last year's class chose the image of construction workers with a clear sense that they had built something that was going to symbolize a strong future for Penn Charter. The year before the class somewhat facetiously chose the image of dinosaurs aware that they were the last representatives of the all-male tradition of the school. Both of those images are clear in their implications. I have had a wonderful time thinking about your image of a roller coaster.

Within the roller coaster metaphor, there are clearly parallels that make sense. The time that you have spent at Penn Charter has been marked by individual peaks and individual low points. At times the ride has been exhilarating as you have been filled with the joy of your own growth and your own accomplishments. At other times, the experience here probably seemed as if you were hurdling out of control. Certainly you know the days represented by that slow climb to the top that one feels in a

roller coaster and the expectation of what will occur when the top is reached.

For me, however, the roller coaster metaphor breaks down in several important ways. Roller coasters follow a prescribed path, one path regardless of the number of people in the cars. You have accomplished a great deal in a wide variety of directions in academics, in the arts, and in athletics. Your voices, whether in class meetings or occasionally in Meeting for Worship, have been individual voices and have not been limited by a company mentality. It strikes me as indicative of this class that your responses to issues and concerns has been thoughtful and diverse. You are not an easy group to categorize. The diversity in the class has brought considerable strength to the class as a whole. My own sense is that you have grown in your appreciation of the variety of talents within the class.

A roller coaster operates the same way every time. Once you are in it, you are there for the ride. There is no help; there is no guidance; there is no con-

cern; there is no coaching from the sidelines. All of those missing qualities I would hope mark your years at Penn Charter. Teachers have given of themselves so that you may come to the teacher within each of you in a way that will produce lifelong learning.

Ultimately, the roller coaster metaphor breaks down completely for me in that when you get off a roller coaster the ride is over and you leave that behind you with little remembrance other than that of a momentary thrill. I would hope that the friendships that you have made here will be lifelong friendships and that the teachers who have worked with you will have a lasting impact on you.

You are an extremely talented class, certainly among the most talented academically of any of the classes at the school in the last twenty years. We hope that those many talents are matched by a commitment to help others as you have done in your service projects this year. You go with our best wishes and our prayers.

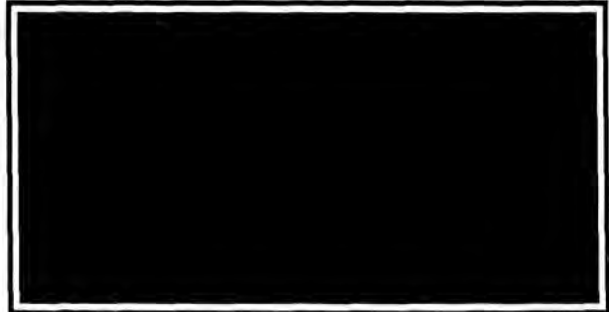

"Andrew" touched down on parts of the Bahamas, Florida, and Louisiana on August 24, killing fifty-five people and causing millions in damage. "Iniki" roughed up the island state of Hawaii just a mere eighteen days later, carrying 160 mph winds, torrential downpours and twenty-foot waves. There were more natural disasters to hit the U.S. Three earthquakes rattled Southern California, injuring hundreds. All three were powerful blasts, measuring more than six on the Richter scale.

Following the acquittal of the four policemen involved in the Rodney King beating, the L.A. riots polarized America and left much of L.A. in ruins.

It would be incorrect to say that things were more pleasant on the international scene. The country of Yugoslavia has been torn apart by ethnic fighting. The intense conflicts have occurred between six major ethnic groups in the region. Thousands have been killed, many more have fled the region and others remain prisoners inside concentration camps in a program called "ethnic cleansing", similar to the activities of the Nazis.

Somalia has experienced one of the worst famines in history, which has killed thousands of people. The anarchical rule of the warlords, who pilfer the much needed relief aid, has further decimated the nation. In December, the United States and its allies flew in troops to ensure the delivery of food to the people and to help restore order.

The trouble with Iraq did not end with a cease-fire. The Allied coalition gave Saddam Hussein an ultimatum to remove missiles from the demilitarized zone in Southern Iraq. A one-day raid on radar and missile targets in January did not end the Iraqi defiance of U.N. resolutions, and so the bombings and missile attacks continued.

Omens for the fate of humanity sent mixed messages. While AIDS became even more of a concern, with new projections estimating that 120 million will

be infected worldwide by the year 2,000, the nuclear threat has diminished with the signing of START II by President Bush and Russian president Boris Yeltsin.

However, there was much to cheer about. The 1992 Olympics was one of the most exciting ever, as the U.S. Basketball team was transformed into the 'Dream Team,' with professional stars like Charles Barkley, Michael Jordan, Magic Johnson, and Chris Mullin. The face of the Olympics has been changed forever with pro players taking part in the festive games. The World Series was turned into an international event as well, as the Toronto Blue Jays won the first baseball world championship for any city outside of the U.S. For some, October, 1992, was a time of celebrating the 500th anniversary of Columbus' fateful voyage. For others, it was a somber reminder of the results of conquest & colonization, intentional or otherwise.

But the most memorable event (and events leading up to it) had to have been the 1992 Presidential Election. What started out as nine guys each vying for his respective party's nomination turned into a dead heat between an elephant, a mule, and Ross Perot. The latter, an outsider businessman with billions, entered the race seeking to reshape America on behalf of the average American. Many voters jumped on his bandwagon early. But when he dropped out, citing his poor odds of victory, many voters turned to Bill Clinton, the Democratic nominee, to repair the failing economy, the number-one concern of many voters. Poor campaigning by the George Bush/Dan Quayle ticket enlarged Clinton's lead in the polls. Then in late September, the rich boy Perot re-entered the race. All three candidates ran hard for the job, re-defining the use of media in campaigning, but on election day, Bill Clinton ousted the incumbent Bush. Clinton received 43% of the vote, Bush 38% and Perot 19%. Many believe that Perot has influenced presidential politics for some time to come.

To the Class of '93: we will be graduating just as President Clinton begins his term, and like him we will have four years of work ahead of us. As we view these images of events during our senior year, let us remember we are inheriting this world. Strive to make it better for the next generation.

wish good luck to Mike, Brian, Danny, Alex, Atiba, Ali and the rest of the 1993 team.

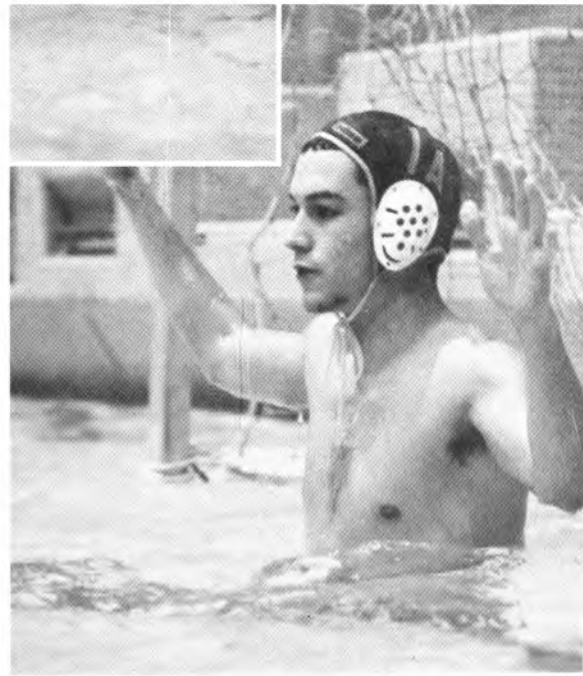
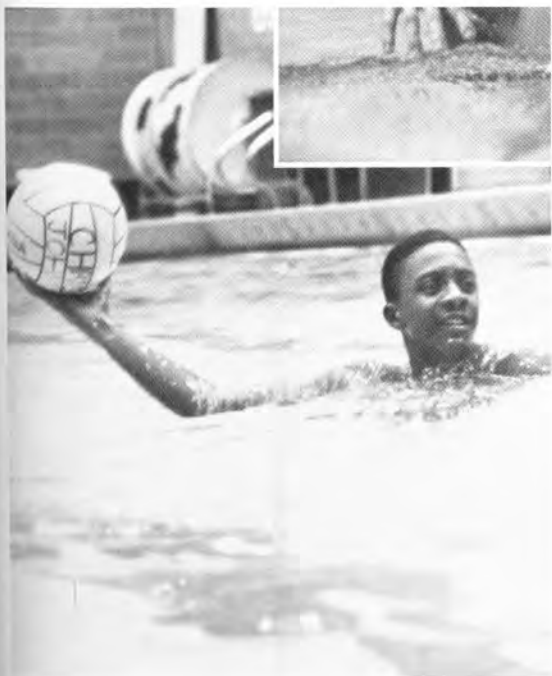
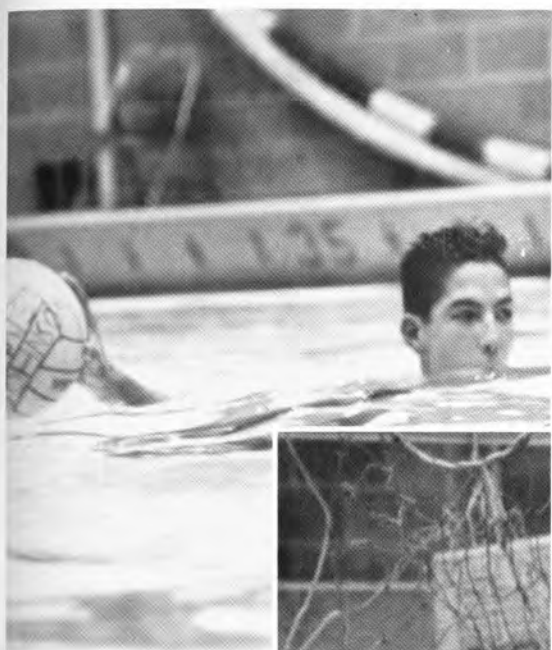

8. When in doubt, plead confusion. Example, "You're kidding! I thought it was due Monday!"





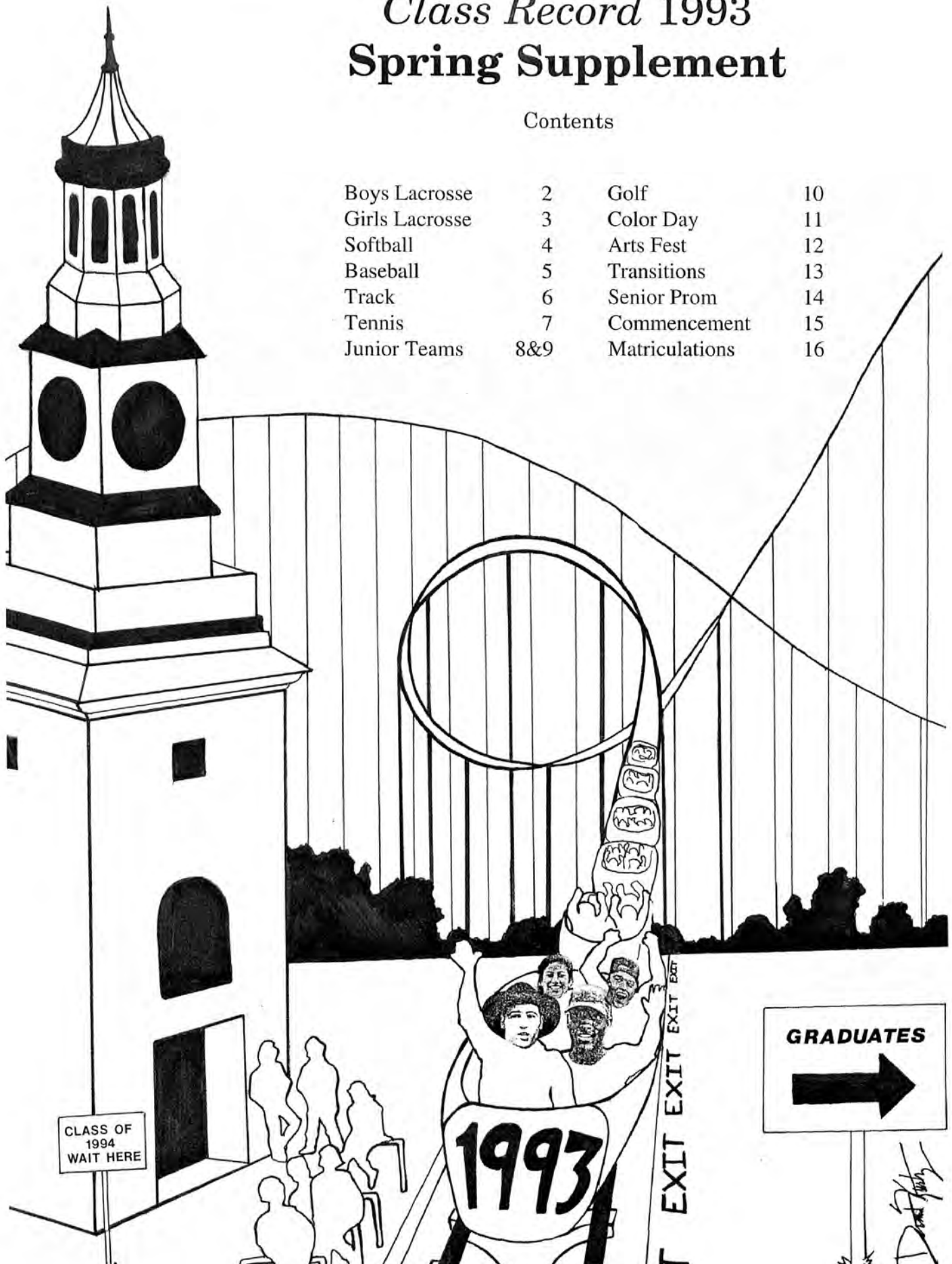

This year's Penn Charter Lacrosse team had a challenging and disappointing season. With only senior John Garvey and sophomores Anthony Balsamo and Andrew Rentschler returning from last year's varsity squad, the team knew it was in for a struggle of a season. Despite their inexperience, they managed to win the Moorestown tournament at the beginning of the season. The Varsity Baseball team had an extremely successful 1992-1993 season, finishing with eight wins and two losses in the Interac. Although this record was only good enough for a second place finish, the team played well despite injuries to three key players. Most debilitating was an injury to starting center fielder Mike Sposato who was batting .400 and had three stolen bases when he went down near mid-season. Head coach Rick Mellor used the bench well to cover for this injury and another to star pitcher John McLaughlin who pulled his rotator-cuff late in the season. McLaughlin finished the season 3-0 with a team leading 1.88 earned run average. Second pitcher Mike Samuel was also dominant, striking out an imposing

thirty-four batters in only thirty innings.

Samuel was the pitcher during the team's most important game of the year—their April 30th game versus Malvern Prep. Penn Charter was a game behind Malvern before pulling out an incredible 4-3 win in the seventh inning. They did so with key hits from Rich Demarco and Lou Marchetti, both of whom had RBIs in the decisive last inning. Samuel then finished Malvern off by mowing down the last three batters on nine pitches.

Penn Charter will be losing key seniors Nick Mahrt, Courtney Batts, Josh Wiegand and DeWitt Brown. Mahrt started every game as catcher, filling in for an injured Trevor O'Driscoll, and tied for the team lead in home runs and was second in RBIs. Batts, perhaps the best baseball player on the Quakers since Ruben Amaro, was the team leader in batting average, runs, stolen bases and on base percentage. Wiegand pro-

vided the team with spirit and leadership while starting in right field. Brown filled in for the injured Sposato in center and played well all season.

Other team leaders were third baseman Frank Maletta and shortstop Rich Demarco. Maletta batted .350 and was second on the team in runs with eleven. He batted leadoff all season and had a huge game on the last day of the season against CHA in which he had two hits, a run, an RBI and a stolen base. Demarco also had his best game of the year against CHA, nearly batting for the cycle. He finished that game with a triple and two doubles.

In non-league games, the Quakers also played well. McLaughlin pitched a no hitter versus Roman and Samuel had two non-league home runs. Overall, this was one of the stronger teams Penn Charter has had in a long time. The players and coaches are all proud of the team's performance.

In 1993 the Penn Charter Track Team remained supreme in the Interac, winning their eighth straight title under Head Coach Stephen Bonnie. The team flourished due to the leadership of its four senior captains, Shawn Morgan, Dale McMillian, Bill Brightcliffe, and Tory Olshansky. Despite a torrential downpour, they made a fine showing at the Coaches Association relays, and placed in several events. At the Father Judge relays, Morgan battled the top runners in the Philadelphia area in the 800 meters, taking third while eclipsing his previous school record. Olshansky vaulted his way to yet another gold in the pole vault. At the Penn Relays, the squad of Morgan, McMillian, Brightcliffe, and junior Jason Winig brought home the gold medal in the Interac boys mile relay. As a result, they had the opportunity to run for the city championship in that event. Olshansky became the first PC pole-vaulter at the Penn relays.

Morgan overwhelmed the competition at the Interac champs, taking the gold in the 800, 1600, and 3200 meters. For his efforts, he was awarded the Greenwood Trophy, presented to the most outstanding performer at Champs. "Air" Dale won the 110 high and 300 intermediate hurdles while also anchoring the mile relay. The team's underclassmen were guided by the team's non-captain seniors: Eric Tulsy, Neil Seidman, Ed Kim, Theo Cavines, and Will Millis.

The girls team continued to excel under the watchful eye of head coach Liz Flemming and should have continued success with the emergence of sophomores Lexy Bloom and Melissa Hemmings. The entire team will lose several key competitors to the college ranks next year, but some stand-out underclassmen are waiting in the wings. Some of these new competitors include: sophomore Jared Kesselheim and junior Mark Eastburn in the

hurdling events, junior Ken Bridges and sophomore Chris Rosanova in the 100 and 200 meters, junior Jason Winig in the 400 and 800 meters, and freshman John Wybar and sophomore Mike James in long distance events. The field events will again be strong next year with junior John Kittredge maintaining leadership in the pole vault and junior Ed Kiefski and sophomore Brian Walls handling the shot put. Lastly, the three jumping events will be led by junior standout Ed Morris. Next year's captains, Winig, Kittredge, Morris, and Bridges should have their hands full, but Coach Bonnie has enough talent on the team to win his ninth straight title.

After having lost five players last year due to graduation, this year's Penn Charter Boys Varsity Tennis Team finished the season in fourth place with a 5-5 Inter-Ac record, and an overall 7-6 mark. The team was led by captains Guy Abramovitz and Bjorn Miller, along with senior Jeremy Atkins. Strong play was provided by Co-MVP's Adam Abel, at third singles, and David Beitchman, who finished the season undefeated, at fourth singles. 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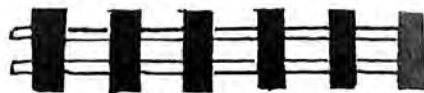

This year's Penn Charter Golf team had a surprisingly successful season, placing third in the Inter-Ac. Last year the team was equipped with a solid core of four seniors, yet the team was a great disappointment. With the loss of those seniors, this year's squad did not begin the season with high hopes; however, as play continued throughout the season, the realization of success materialized. The lone senior on this year's team, Polk Smartt, was the team's emotional leader as a co-captain. Amazingly, and for the first time that Mr. Linton can remember, the two teams tied. The future certainly looks bright for the young team, only losing one senior. 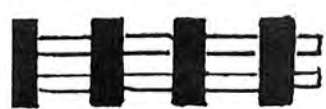
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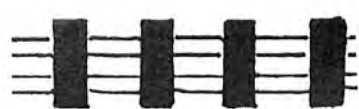

All three graduation speakers addressed the theme of community & the relationships within. For **Theo Caviness**, a ninth-grade transfer from the public schools, it was "the class of 1993 [that] made me come to love Penn Charter." For him, "...experiences just aren't experiences without friends to share them with." Theo found a richness of community within the diversity of his classmates: "We're the strangest group of people I know. Where else could you find such musicians, leaders, athletes, comedians, wise acres, and all-around great people than in this class?"

**Andrea Koplove** noted that the relationships within this community helped to make her eight years here pass very quickly, as a once-scared fifth-grader was now a graduate who was reluctant to leave. "In those eight years she grew so comfortable in the school that it was like a home away from home." While the future might seem daunting, "...she has an advantage. She has her Penn Charter experience. The memories might make her laugh. They might make her cry, but she knows that by keeping in her heart those people she has told you about, and the many, many more who have touched and enriched her life, the memories of

her Penn Charter experience will always give her strength."

While **Gwo Ing Lee** also noted the strengths of the community, she posed a question that challenges the community to strive to become even better than we already are. "How is it that even though everything in school, when broken down to its bare essence, is pleasant, school still remains so unpleasant for so many of us?" Her conclusion: "...there's no answer to my question. Education is not about providing universal answers for the questions of life and it's not about the absolute truth, either. However, education is about providing one with better knowledge and a wider perspective on each problem, offering a wider base on which to [found] decisions. Education is about providing a balance between an imperfect world and perfect ideals." A school can not ignore its human resources.

Theo, Andrea & Gwo each expressed, in their own ways, a sense of what the school community has given them, and have left with us perspectives and ideas to contemplate about the friendships, pedagogy, and issues that contributed to their, and our, Penn Charter experiences.
