


he Upper School Winter Concert

Wrestling

The Wrestling team this year was very dedicated, hard working, and successful. The team demonstrated their desire for success and dedication this summer as a record setting number of wrestlers came to the team camp at University of Virginia. 
Basketball

Despite losing Ryan and Boles, the Quakers did return three All-InterAc starters: reliable junior guard Zack Zeglinski, and one of the best 1-2 punches in the city in point guard Sean Singletary and forward Rob Kurz. These players, along with a deep bench that included Hanif Hopkins, Dave McEnerney, Joe Rauchut, Brian Teuber, and R.J. Lyons, were poised to lead the team to its second consecutive InterAc title.

However, things did not come easy for the Quakers. The season started out at the Bull City Classic in North Carolina, with PC set to square off against two nationally ranked teams. They held their own in a win and an overtime loss, highlighted by two fabulous performances by Singletary. These games showed that the Quakers could play with any team in the country. Also included on the Quakers' schedule were some of the area's top teams such as St. John Neumann, St. Joe's Prep, and Cardinal Dougherty. And if that wasn't enough, the league was as deep and talented as ever, with GA, Episcopal, and Malvern all boasting fine teams.

After three straight losses at the Slam Dunk to the Beach Tournament to end 2003, the Quakers had a mediocre record of 6-6 and many people in the city were questioning whether or not the team was as good as advertised. But PC silenced all critics by winning fourteen of the next fifteen games with the only loss coming in a nail biting thriller against city powerhouse Cardinal Dougherty. The Quakers also silenced all talk that they weren't the InterAc's best team by going 10-0 in the league for a second consecutive year (the first time since 1964 for a PC team), winning the championship and defeating league opponents by an average of 21 points per game.

Although the team will lose Singletary (Virginia) and Kurz (Notre Dame) to graduation, there is still much to look forward to next year. The Zeglinski brothers are big time players who should wreak havoc on the league next year, while physical

players Hollinshead, Rauchut, and Teuber will all return. So even though the best senior duo the school has seen in quite some time will be gone, a three-peat is not out of the question.






Swimming



There were all kinds of questions facing the varsity baseball team coming into the 2004 season. The first was would they be able to recover from the graduation of four starters, including the team's two best players, power hitter Taylor Baum and infielder/pitcher Matt Ryan? From this first question emerged another: without these four players, how would the Quakers get on base and manufacture runs? Also, with Matt Ryan gone and junior co-captain Ryan Nanni being kept off the mound due to an arm injury, could the team find the pitchers to succeed? It wasn't always easy, but the Quakers opened a lot of eyes and turned many of their doubters into believers during the course of the season.

Led by four rising junior stars (CF, Ryan Nanni; SS, Zack Zeglinski; C, R.J. Hollinshead; and P, Sean Rust), PC jumped out to an early start by winning the first game of the season over visiting Roman. They dropped the following game to Catholic League powerhouse Cardinal O'Hara before leaving for a 10-day trip to Clearwater, Florida over Spring Break. On our trip the team spent hours each day learning the fundamentals of the game, with access to top notch facilities. The trip worked: upon returning, the Quakers roared out to 9 consecutive wins, quietly creating buzz around the city that this was in fact a team that should not be taken lightly. Unfortunately for the young and relatively inexperienced Quakers, the InterAc was the strongest it had ever been, with Malvern, one of the top teams in the area, and GA, now a nationally ranked team. Due to the tough competition, PC was slated to finish no higher than fourth place in the league. This didn't bother the Quakers, though. They knew they were a talented and scrappy bunch and as long as they believed in themselves, a league championship was not out of the question.

The team took this attitude into league play and stormed out to a 4-0 start, including an unbelieveable, extra innings classic over Malvern. Fighting for first place against mighty GA, the Quakers were determined to shock the world. Unfortunately, it wasn't meant to be as GA and their six division—I starters trounced PC in both league contests, 9-0 and 14-0. After a 4-0 start, the Quakers slipped and dropped the next 4, and they were able to rebound and win the final two games, including another win over Malvern. The 6-4 record was good for second place, which was much better than anyone thought the team would do. After the season, PC went to the State Playoffs and got another shot at GA. The Quakers held their own, but the Patriots stormed back late in the game and won 3-2. While GA and Malvern will graduate most of its roster, PC will lose only 2 starters, 3B David Skinner and P/1B Corey Thomas. The four junior stars will all return as seniors to wreak havoc on the league, and they will be joined by other standout players such as senior Marc Spagnoletti, junior Mike Parrilla, and sophomores Sammy Zeglinski and Mark Adzick. With all of these talented players returning, an InterAc title seems inevitable.
