

Ball III for his outstanding leadership and commitment to Penn Charter as Head of School for the last 31 years. Dr. Ball has made many extraordinary contributions to the Penn Charter community. Since Dr. Ball arrived in 1976, Penn Charter has changed dramatically. Dr. Ball is responsible for the integration of coeducation, the large growth in diversity, scholarship aid in the Lower School, the expansion of the arts and music programs, enriched academic programs, and extensive community service and service learning programs. Dr. Ball has also conducted many successful capital campaigns, including the Frameworks for the Future Campaign, which raised 45 million dollars for the preservation and growth of Penn Charter and its Quaker principles. After finishing second in the league last year, the Quakers set out to win an InterAc championship. Penn Charter had an extremely tough out of league schedule, with games against perennial power houses Archbishop Wood, The Hun School and Valley Forge Military Academy. The Quakers played tough and escaped the non-league season with a 3-2 record. However, the tough InterAc schedule loomed ahead.

Penn Charter's InterAc season opener was against Chestnut Hill Academy, who was playing in their first league game in 33 years. The Quakers outlasted the Blue Devils 17-14, thanks to a 37 yard game winning field goal by Eric Muller, and some defensive heroics by linebacker Sam Biddle as the clock wound down. Against Episcopal Academy in their mud bowl the Quakers dominated the field position and won on a late fourth quarter TD by Sean McNally, set up by newly-inserted wide-out Eddie Bambino's gravity-defying catch. The Quakers' next opponent was the reigning InterAc Champs, the Friars of Malvern Prep. Sophomore quarterback John Ryan started for a PC team that came out of the gates firing on all cylinders. The Quakers raced to a 23-7 halftime lead, but was clinging to a slim 23-19 lead in the final minutes of regulation. After an incredibly bad call gave Malvern a first down deep in PC territory, Joe Rauchut led the defense in a heroic goal line stand, keeping the Friars out of the end zone at their own 3 yard line as time expired. Penn Charter then dominated Haverford 56-0, setting up a championship game against arch rival Germantown Academy. The historic 120th annual meeting between PC and GA proved to be another classic. The Quakers raced to a 14-10 halftime lead (after another Ryan to Bambino TD hookup), and controlled the clock to win 21-10. This victory cemented the Quakers their first solo InterAc Championship since 2002, the first Penn Charter team to go 5-0 in the InterAc since 1967.

Penn Charter graduate killed in Maine snowboarding accident

Andrew M. Peff, a 2007 William Penn Charter School graduate in his second semester at Colby College in Waterville, Maine, died Saturday in a snowboarding accident near the college.

Peff, 19, of Jenkintown, had gone with friends to Sugarloaf, a popular ski and snowboarding venue in Carrabassett Valley, about an hour from Colby, according to James Terhune, dean of students.

Local news reports said Peff was boarding on an expert-level trail around 11 a.m. when he went off the trail and into the woods. He died after hitting a tree, Terhune said.

Although he was a second-semester freshman, Peff had arrived on campus only two weeks ago. He had spent his first semester in Dijon, France, as part of a language-immersion program. But in the short time he was on campus, Terhune said yesterday, "Andrew really wasted no time getting actively involved in the community."

Terhune said he had talked with Peff shortly after the young man arrived on campus and learned that he hoped to try out for the lacrosse team and possibly sign up for several student clubs.

"He was a really talented young man who was really excited about starting at Colby," Terhune said. "We were certainly thrilled to have him here."

At Penn Charter in East Falls, Peff was remembered yesterday as a bright student who was especially strong in French. Officials recalled him as a talented athlete and a saxophonist in the school band.

He also was an enthusiastic member of an unofficial cheering squad whose members wore yellow T-shirts emblazoned with "Quaker Crew" and rooted for the basketball team. Sports teams at Penn Charter are known as the

"Andrew was a great kid," said Paul Butler, the school's athletic director, citing Peff's consistent contributions on the varsity soccer team in fall and lacrosse team in spring. He also had played football.

Though of average size and build, Butler said, "Andrew was a strong performer and a really valued part of all of those teams."



The highlight of the InterAc season for the Quakers was the last game of the season, against a confident, first place Chestnut Hill team. With Adzick back, Charter pulled a huge upset by winning 4-1, causing Chestnut Hill to settle for a tie with Malvern for first place. Adzick's "stuff" was working so well, and his pitching was so masterful, it could "make a grown man cry." Coach Mellor has said on a number of occasions that if the team could have played a complete seven innings in every game, they could have captured the InterAc title. It will be very upsetting to lose important seniors, including Mark Adzick (7-1, 1.66 earned run average, .343 batting avg.), Billy Goldman (.361 batting average), Sam Zeglinski (all three earning All-League honors), Tom Caramanico, Mario Incollingo, Mike Basile, Josh Heinsheimer, and Jon Torrey. The Quakers have a lot of good, young talent that should enable the PC to really make some noise in both the InterAc and in the state tournament next year. With the valuable experience gained by Mike Carroll, Mark Rhine (.333 batting avg.). Rob Amaro and All-League catcher Doug Fleming (.370 batting avg., led the team in home runs and extra-base hits), Charter will be in the thick of the InterAc title race in 2008.




